WHAT ARE ALL THE DIFFERENT VENUES WE USE AT THE HOLIDAY WEEK?

ASSEMBLY HALL:

This space is where we gather for All Age Worship, Adult Worship and other Adult organised programme. Each morning the Castlewellan family connect to participate in family worship before the children and young people head off to their own programme.

CHILDREN'S VENUES:

Our children's programme is split into different age groups: Sparks Mini's, Junior's and Seniors. Please look out for SPARKS in the daily timetables to help you navigate drop offs and collection.

CLASSROOMS:

Sparks Mini's, Juniors & Seniors will be allocated two classrooms each which they will use to organise their morning programme.

DRAMA THEATRE:

Part of the children's programme involves the age groups coming together for a set time each morning. This will take place in the Drama Theatre which is a few doors down from the Creche on the left. This is where you will pick your children up in the morning at 12:30pm CRECHE:

This is located in the closest classroom to the Assembly Hall. Children can be dropped off at 9:30am - 12:30pm

YOUTH VENUES

The youth programme is split into SECTORS. SECTOR 1 (Years 8-10) & SECTOR 4 (Year 11+),

UNDERGROUND:

The youth venue is called the UNDERGROUND. It consists of two large sports halls at the far end of the building. Keep walking along the main corridor until you get to the end, then go down the stairs and follow the noise. This is where you will find the teenagers most of the week. Please note that we will be taking the Sectors off site to Castlewellan Presbyterian Church for on evening session during the week.

PRAYER AT THE FAMILY WEEK

IS THERE A PRAYER TEAM?

Prayer is a high value for us, and therefore a common thread throughout the programme for adults, young people and children. This year we get the opportunity to offer prayer across the board in person. Anyone who serves on a prayer team will have received training in advance. Prayer Ministry is nothing more than prayer ministry. The teams are not counsellors nor will they offer that, they are simply there to help you pray; inviting God, the creator of the world, our friend, comforter and healer into your life and situations.

Adam and Natalie Lyner will be coordinating the adult prayer team in the morning sessions, where ministry will be available after Derek has spoken. We encourage you to do this if you are feeling burdened or struggling with anything, or if you are just hungry for more of God!

COFFEE BREAK AT THE FAMILY WEEK

During coffee break each morning there will be an opportunity to gather for refreshments after the morning worship. This is a wonderful informal time for you to talk to friends and meet new people. We hope that our coffee will be smooth and your conversation will be full of laughter and inspiration.

SMALL GROUPS AT THE FAMILY WEEK

All adults who register for the Conference have the opportunity to be part of a Small Group. You will be allocated an optional small group to be part of throughout the week. In these groups you will have the opportunity to share thoughts, ideas and times of prayer around the theme which has been spoken about that morning.

We inspire and equip individuals, families and churches across the country to play their part to ensure that every child experiences the stability, care and sense of belonging they deserve. Through our resources, content and training packages, we practically equip individuals and families as they explore fostering, adoption or supported lodgings for teenagers. We mobilise churches and communities to welcome, understand and support families who love and raise children with lived experience of care.

CREATING SPACE | Sheena McCartney - Love for Life

In an increasingly complicated world, which seems to be accelerating and changing all the time, the task of parenting can seem daunting. How can we create space for clarity and compassion as we step confidently into conversations about relationships and sex? 
